Presidents Report

Season 05/06 hopefully will become a season in which a foundation was laid for the future.

Given the loss of experience from Matthew Elliott (transfer to South Australia), Matthew Hayward (returned home to Queensland) and David Beardsley (retirement) there were plenty of opportunities for the less experienced players to put their hand up.

The results up until xmas from a 1st XI perspective were very encouraging with the team in 4th position, displaying improved one day form and continued strong two day performances.

Unfortunately our one day form let us down in the second half of the season and we just missed the finals. However, the appointment of Aaron Kellett as Coach and the continuation of Damian Shanahan as 1st XI Captain provided a strong leadership team.

Kel's new coaching program and methods were well and truly accepted by the entire playing group and Damian's onfield leadership ensured that all teams were competitive with an emphasis on establishing a Camberwell Magpies playing brand.

The 3rd XI, under Warren Robert's captaincy, again made the finals. Unfortunately they came up against a brilliant individual performance by an opposition player that was the difference in their continuation in the finals.

One bright spot was Ben Hanley's magnificent century in the Quarter Final which highlighted his talent. Hopefully, Ben can use this innings as a spring board to cementing a permanent place in the higher elevens, next season.

The 2nd & 4th XI's were again competitive without making the finals. The 4th XI certainly introduced and unearthed a number of new players into the Club, including a number of boys who were still playing in the Clubs juniors. This was very pleasing and hopefully one day we will be able to produce a Victorian Bushranger that started in our Milo Program and progressed all the way through the Juniors and Seniors.

Glenn Parker has made a great start progressing to the 2nd XI this season and hopefully it won't be long before Karl Wissell, James Betts or Ayrton Eldridge all follow suit.

With respect to representative cricket, Jack McNamara not only played for the Victorian Under 19's at the National Carnival, he was also selected in the Australian Under 19 team that competed in the World Cup in Sri Lanka.

Jack played in all of the matches and was a solid consistent performer throughout the tournament. Jack is proving to be a great role model around the Club and it certainly was exciting for the Club to have an Australian representative. Congratulations Jack!

The Club this season participated in the Premier Competition 20/20 matches for the first time and given our one day record, we were surprised and pleased to make the Quarter Finals. As part of this competition we decided to play our home match at the North Balwyn Cricket Club. The purpose of this was to provide our support to one of our larger local Clubs and to give as many

people an opportunity to witness Premier Cricket.

The afternoon/evening was a terrific success, with many spectators, a great match and plenty of socialising. I would personally like to thank the North Balwyn CC for their support of this initiative and for being fantastic hosts. It is certainly something we will endeavour to do again as part of this competition.

Added to this, we have established a great relationship with the Moama Magpies Cricket Club. We played our Country Round match against St Kilda there, and prior to that played a Pre-Season practice match. Lloyd Rosenow and his Committee are fantastic cricket enthusiasts and very sociable hosts. They have a great playing facility that we will continue to use where possible in the future.

The Juniors once again had a fantastic season with four of the ten teams playing in Grand Finals, for two wins. Lawrie McMahon and his team do a terrific job coordinating the training and playing of over one hundred boys and girls. This season the Senior Club supported the Juniors through the hosting of a Pre-Season Cricket Camp at the Camberwell Sports Ground during the September School Holidays as well as conducting the Matthew Elliott Squad. A couple of the senior players also provided coaching for a couple of the junior teams.

From a financial perspective we have managed for the first time in three years to post a small profit. This is due to the enormous voluntary hard work undertaken by the Committee and also the efforts of Lisa Emrose our Cricket Administration Manager.

Lisa worked very hard in the off-season to secure a number of new sponsors. I thank all of our sponsors for their support and contribution. Our Club certainly couldn't survive without these sponsors and we look forward to continuing our partnership in the forth-coming season.

While the centre wicket and outfield facilities at the Camberwell Sports Ground were not rated as well as in previous years, our relationship with the Council and their support, is as strong as ever. The practice wickets were very good and we have already agreed on a program to rectify the problems encountered with the outfield for next season.

Added to this in the off-season, work has commenced to erect new fencing to minimise the risks associated with cricket balls hit out of the playing area and the Social Rooms have been fully refurbished. The Old Scotch Football Club has been instrumental in the refurbishment and I would like to thank Tim Shearer and his Committee, especially Milton Cations, for their hard work.

We now have our honour boards permanently on the wall and Jack Ryder has pride of place. The rooms have certainly been transformed and I'm looking forward to increased use of the rooms and an overall improvement in the social aspects of the Club.

The Annual Ball was once again a big highlight of our social program. Thanks to all those who attended the Carlton Crest to make it a great night.

As always, the Committee has been working hard in the off season to setup the Club and programs for the forth coming season. Unfortunately, Aaron Kellett advised us in May that due to his work commitments with the Western Bulldogs he could not devote the time required to coach the Club in 06/07. He will continue to play and assist as much as possible.

As a result, the Club has appointed Damian Shanahan as its Captain Coach for the 2006/2007 season. We have also appointed a number of non-playing coaches to support Damian. These include Anthony McQuire, Shannon Young, Ravi Ratnayeke and David Beardsley.

We are also in the process of further establishing and refining our two critical development squads, Matthew Elliott and Emerging Magpies. Speros Beasley and Anthony Hall have been appointed joint leaders of the 4th XI and their role will be to introduce and teach new younger players into the Club through our juniors and from the pathway programs.

I'm certainly looking forward to the forth-coming season and the continued development and maturity of our playing group. We now have a number of experienced mature aged players who have a great opportunity to work closely with Damian to establish the Magpies playing brand, not only for next season but for the following seasons.

Finally, I would like to thank everyone on the Committee, especially Adam Smith and Peter Warner for their continued tireless hard work and time. Lisa once again has done a great job and unfortunately, due to increasing work commitments will not be continuing in the Cricket Administration role.

The Club has recently appointed Rohan Lawton to replace Lisa and we welcome Rohan to the Club and are looking forward to his technological system knowledge and skills to take us to another level from a management perspective.

- Simon Eastham's competent keeping display all season and Andrew Clarke's two diving catches in the final.

The batting was generally good. The side was always able to post a competitive score except for the collapse against South Melbourne (on a wet wicket) and in the final. All three plus Ben Hanley should strongly push for a second eleven batting spot next season.

The catching and ground fielding was generally reliable and helped the bowlers build pressure.

Finally thank you to all the players who played in the third eleven during the season for your support, assistance and friendship. The third eleven can be a difficult eleven to play in for a number of reasons and the way the players played the game was a credit to them and the Club. I look forward to seeing many of you building next year on the foundations of 2005/2006 and progressing into the seconds next season.

Junior Division Report

The Junior Division had both its greatest numbers and greatest success for some years this season. We fielded 11 teams: 2 U10, 3 U12 (A Grade and 2 B Grade), 4 U14 (A Grade, 2 B Grade and 1 C Grade) and 2 U16 (B Grade and C Grade). Five of a possible 7 teams reached the finals and 4 of these played in their respective Grand Final. We had 2 premiers (U16B, U14A) and 2 Runners-up (U12A and U14B). The U12 A team in particular was unfortunate: after dominating the competition all year it lost by one run on the day: a lesson for all the boys to carry forward with them. In addition, at the end of the season, CMCC boys from almost every age group and grade were awarded ECA medals and trophies and/or played in representative teams – generally demonstrating just what talent is available for the future within the club.

The U16 squads trained as a single unit under the coaching and managerial direction of Alex Down, Ian Dinnison and Simon Draycott. It was a testament to the spirit of each team that they made the finals and they saved the best for last. The U16B faced a tough ask of defending just over 80 runs in the final game. They made it easily after an inspired spell of bowling from their captain, Harry Down. The camaraderie in the team was palpable throughout the season (some of the boys having played with each other since U10) and their delight at winning the flag was shared by all. The U16C did not make the final unfortunately, going down to a very strong opposition in the semi. However, if there were a match to show the spirit that lives within the club, this was it. Facing a routine, clinical demolition by a better team on the day, the players came within a whisker of turning the tables only to go down a few runs short of what seemed an impossible target. More could not have been asked from them.

The U14 squads were ably coached and managed by a combination of parents, mentors and experts (basically everyone else watching any training session or match). The A squad was the sleeping giant of the competition. Although sometimes brittle in the home and away matches, it proved its dominance in the semi and again in the final, winning by an improbable 9 wickets in its last match. Perhaps what the boys learnt most between the first and second half of the season was how to stop playing as individuals and to start playing as a team. The effect was obvious to all as well as evident in the scorebook. Thanks to Bruce Richards, Luke Muttdon and Glen Parker for tireless effort over the season.

The U14B teams demonstrated a combination of tenacity, talent and grit. One of the teams reached the final but was unable to produce a winning combination on the day. Throughout the season its coach and mentor, Simon Daish and Harry Down, continued to comment on the goodwill, friendship and team spirit shown by the boys. This will stand them in good stead over the years. The other U14B team was managed by Tony Van Rensburg and John Flett and coached by Will McMahon and Dan Wolfe. They experienced a difficult time adapting to two different competitions through the season however resolutely stuck at their task and showed on several occasions just what could be achieved in future seasons. Similarly, the U14C team managed by Phil Smith, with Will McMahon and Dan Wolfe coaching, improved markedly through the season. It ended up with a vastly more competitive team which, nonetheless, continued to find the fun in each game and was ready always to play out the game.

The U12 teams were difficult to coordinate. There was a selection of extremely gifted players in the U12A squad, making it difficult each week to choose the right combination. As outlined above, the U12A dominated through the season and was unfortunate to miss out on the premiership at the end by the smallest margin. They were flanked by a well-intentioned but largely 'new to cricket' group in the U12B which learnt a great deal through the season and which contributed players of equal calibre (a surprise to some boys in the 'A' squad) when asked to assist in the latter half of the season. Thanks to Chris Eldridge, Paul Quinn, Roger Dray and Stewart Evans for hours of time at training, endless discussions, patience of Job, forbearance under attack and, of course, coaching input. Thanks also to the coaches, Will McMahon and Dan Wolfe yet again for their input through the season.

The other U12B team should probably have been rated as an U12C team. Andy Harper kindly agreed to take on the unenviable challenge of bringing this disparate group (of age and skill) together. Although it had some real successes, it was hampered by the fact that some of its players had never played before and others were very junior. Improvements for the coming season are inevitable.

The U10 squad was new for the season as we did not have any U10 the year before. We started thinking it would be just one team but it quickly grew into 2 teams bursting at the seams. Through the guidance of its understanding and insightful managers, Gareth Mellor and Mark Woolley, what was particularly noticeable throughout the season was the fun and involvement shown by the many parents which, of course, filtered down to the boys. We look forward to continuing the U10 squad next year and many of the current squad have already said they are looking to move 'up' to the U12 next year regardless of age. May their determination and their heart go with them.

Finally, it is for me to thank all the people who have contributed throughout the season, without whom the Junior Division could not run. These include the parents who contribute each week through scoring, umpiring and, at times, even training; the managers and coaches with their cheerful understanding of the 'way things are'; the extraordinary and untiring efforts of our registrar (Georgina Bett) and treasurer (Greg Keys) as well as their sage advice on numerous testing occasions; and finally, the quiet, unostentatious support of the wives of many of the afore-mentioned managers and coaches – to name a few, Kaye Down, Louise Richards, Caroline Keys, and my own wife, Penny, possibly most of all. Endless thanks.

As a season overall, it was one with few problems, dominated by goodwill, competitive fun and acceptance. Which is not to say it cannot be improved. Since the end of the season, we have formulated a committee of 7 people who will address areas of concern, assume specific portfolios and enable a more rigorous and robust discussion of problems and issues if and as they arise during the season. We are looking hard at our coaching options (a perennial problem) and team structure, and ensuring that communication at all levels is improved. Each player must be able to contribute at whatever level they play and to feel they are wanted and respected. They, in turn, need to provide a commitment to their team in order for this to be achieved. All real challenges for the season ahead. Bring it on.

Financial Report

An operating surplus of a little over \$2,000 represents a good financial result for the club this season.

Expenses were extremely well managed with an increased focus on managing significant items such as cricket balls and indoor training facility hire helping us to reduce our overall cost of running the club by \$1,000 from last season. When combined with revenue from increased player subscription fees, this allowed us to achieve the desired outcome of reversing last season's deficit.

The junior section of the club operated at a deficit of a little over \$1,000 this season.

Since the incorporation of the Camberwell Magpies 10 years ago we have managed to maintain a strong balance sheet through the generosity of sponsors, the hard work of many volunteers and diligent financial management. Finally we are in a position where we can plough some of our reserves back into facilities that players and supporters will be able to enjoy for many years to come.

With a terrific amount of work from our co-tenants the Old Scotch Football Club and support from the Council, we have embarked on a significant refurbishment of the clubrooms at Camberwell Sportsground. The first stage of the refurbishment is all but complete – the impact partly reflected in the financial books with the early work included under Extraordinary Items. The major investment is still to come and our challenge will now be to re-build our reserves in order to ensure we can maintain facilities of this standard, but the new rooms should help us to attract additional social and sponsorship revenue.

In achieving this operating result and getting this exciting project off the ground, I wish to record the club's appreciation to the following:
