Memorial Tributes

Vale – Frank Beach

We record the passing of Life-Member and wonderful supporter, Frank Beach, at the age of 81.

A non-player, Frank (like his father before him) followed sport at Camberwell Sports Ground (be it cricket or football) for most of his life. He would probably rank as Camberwell's greatest and longest serving supporter. As a younger man, in the latter 1950's, 1960's and 1970's, Frank was popular home team manager, and organised social arrangements during and (for a time) after the game. A fine local sports fan (known to barrack for his team) he served on the Club Committee from 1958-70.

In later years, Frank continued to support the home teams, CFC, Old Scotch FC, CCC or Camberwell Magpies CC, often enjoying a convivial ale with close CFC friend, Alan Baker (another great football and cricket supporter) and others. We extend our deepest sympathy to brother, Andrew Beach and Family.

Vale – Peter "Father" Gannon

A Life-Member and player efficiently known to all young or old as "Father" Peter passed away mid season while enjoying his other great love fishing.

A schoolmaster, Peter and his family lived in Rowell Avenue (over the back fence) from the Camberwell oval. He initially became involved with the Club when son, Matthew, showed an interest in becoming a Camberwell junior player. Peter played with the Fifth (or Club Eleven) in 1981, before he and Matthew had the opportunity to play senior cricket together. He improved 'out of sight' as a player, winning promotion to the Fourth and Third Elevens.

Eventually, Peter became a Club Captain, leading the Fifts in 1984-85 and the Fourths from 1988-93. Under his leadership, the Fourths won a premierships in 1991-92, were runners-up in 1992-93 (losing by 3 runs) and won another pennant in 1993-94 (when he was Vice-Captain). Peter ended his playing career as a member of the Thirds 1995-96 premiership side (led by good mate, Kevin Hannett). Amongst his best performances was a score of 80 versus Riversdale-Boroondara and 5/40 against Donvale. In all Peter played 101 Games for the Club and was also known for his "Very Slow" bowling.

A great clubman, Peter served on the Club Committee from 1987-94 and is missed by his many friends at Camberwell. We extend our heartfelt sympathy to Nathalie and Family.

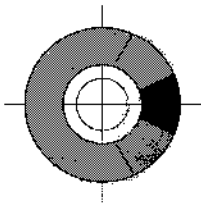
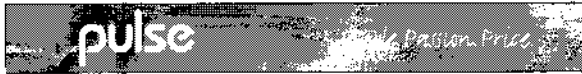

Development Squads

Emerging Magpies Squad

The Club continued its Emerging Magpies Development Program for young players in 2006/07 which included boys from the Club's Junior section as well as a number from the Inner East region who were included in the squad after consultation with Cricket Victoria Regional Cricket Manager Rohan O'Neill.

The program for the season incorporated the following:

- The squad comprised an initial 16 boys in the 14-16 years age group who attended specialist sessions at Hawthorn Indoor Centre during February and March under the direction of Assistant Coach Anthony McQuire

Anthony was assisted by Russell Hutton and Glen Parker with each session being specifically focused on specific skill development following the boy's involvement within the CV Pathway program earlier in the year.

- A further evening was arranged in the clubrooms during which invited guest Cricket Victoria Umpiring Director Bob Stratford gave a most informative presentation to the group on a vast array of umpiring rules and decisions, player behavior and etiquette towards umpires, and towards the Game itself. He finished up with a series of written questions and answers to test the boy's knowledge of the Rules.

The boys thought that this experience was well worthwhile in further developing their cricketing knowledge, particularly from an actual umpiring perspective.

- A final session was held on the centre wicket at Camberwell in the form of a Twenty20 match in March with the squad being given various match type scenarios in this form of the game and having to work through a Twenty20 type innings. A number of senior players batted with the boys with continuous advice during their innings to enable them to think through and work towards the result that they were trying to achieve under varying scenarios.

- The squad was individually invited to attend senior training on specific nights at which time they received dedicated advice from the club's coaching staff particular to their chosen discipline whilst joining in the intensity of a Premier Club's training sessions.
- The CMCC is changing its coaching delivery to its Emerging Magpies squad for the coming season and has booked 3 hour sessions for 6 nights during July/August 2007 at Hawthorn Indoor Centre. On each night 3 boys will individually receive in a 1 hour time slot dedicated advice from 3 senior coaches on a one on one basis with the end result that there will be 18 one hour sessions rather than in continuous group form with a whole squad to contend with.

My thanks to Anthony, Russell, Glen and the other senior players who took time to involve themselves with this most vital part of the Club's future success.

Matthew Elliott Squad

As a result of a heavy fixture programming and the difficult conditions experienced with water minimisation which led to a diminution of ground usage during the season it was decided to defer the Matthew Elliott squad sessions planned for 2006/07 until the pre Christmas period in 2007 when conditions hopefully will have improved.

We apologise to those boys chosen in the squad for this season for not being able to successfully run the sessions but extreme circumstances unfortunately forced our hand.

We look forward to the further development of our squad members during 2007/08 with much excitement as they begin to capitalise on the skills they have honed and begin the move into senior ranks.

Over this period of time, Warren has served the Club with distinction as a Player, Captain Committeeman, Treasurer, President and Delegate to Cricket Victoria.

The following summary provides a detailed history of his service:

- 412 Games Played
- 1973/74: Commenced with Collingwood CC Dowling Shield side
- 1978: Represented Victoria under 19's at the Australasian carnival in New Zealand
- 1980: Selected in a State Second XI game
- Late 70's and 80's: Played 80 First XI games.
- Mid 1980's: Appointed to Collingwood CC Committee becoming the youngest ever club delegate to VCA. Warren remained as such for 12 years and was given VCA life membership in the late 1990's.
- 1987/88: 12th Man for 1st XI Premiership
- 1988/89: Played in 2nd XI Premiership
- 1989-92: CCC Captain Second XI, including Premiership in 1990/91.
- 1993-95: CCC Captain Third XI

- 1995/96: Last President of CCC
- 1996/97: First President of CMCC.
- 1996-99: Ran Milo Have-a-Go program
- 1998: Returned to playing as 3rd XI captain.
- Out of 14 years of captaining at both CCC and CMCC Warren's teams have only twice finished lower than 5th.
- He has captained one two- day (1990/1991) and one one-day premiership (2003/2004) and been in four other grand finals.

Throughout the second half of his career, Warren has been fully supported by his wonderful wife, Jenny. Lately, Alex has been the scorer for the 3rd XI Junior Player and Louise has provided valuable service on the scoreboard at Watson Park for 3rd XI home matches.

We wish the Roberts family good health for the future and thank all of them for their tireless voluntary support and involvement with the Club and look forward to seeing them around socially for many years to come.

Presidents Report

Once upon on a time..... 11 years ago, two cricket Clubs (Collingwood & Camberwell) came together to form the Camberwell Magpies Cricket Club. Yes, the Magpies are now eleven years old and there has been lots of progress made and achievements since our inception – too many to list!

From a playing perspective, season 2006/2007 was one of our most successful seasons to date. We finished 5th in the Club Championship, and made the 1st XI semi-finals in all three competitions Twenty/20, One Day & Two Day.

The significant improvement in the One Day competition was very pleasing given the previous year we managed to only win two matches in this form of the game.

On the Twenty20 front, we hosted one match at the CSG and were amazed to see nearly 200 people turn up to watch our match against Richmond. The evening was a wonderful success, with a fantastic atmosphere and included some big hitting and cricket entertainment by both sides.

The new look CSG, with its more modern and open environment enabled a lot more people to see what was happening and to walk in for a better look. I'd like to thank the City of Boroondara for the work undertaken to erect the new safety fencing and the more conducive open environment for watching cricket.

I'd also like to thank the Council for agreeing to fund the CSG Pavilion Change Room refurbishment, which commenced in April 2007. I'm sure when the work is finished, expected to be August/September 2007, we will be the envy of all other Premier Clubs when they visit us next season.

This refurbishment work would not have come about without significant input from our ground partners the Old Scotch Football Club and the tireless efforts of their President, Tim Shearer. Tim has spent a lot of time and effort on behalf of both Clubs bringing this altogether and with the help of Milton Cations was instrumental in the Social Room upgrade which has added another dimension from a social perspective to both Clubs.

It is also my pleasure to announce that in April 2007, both the Football and Cricket Clubs signed off on a ten year sponsorship deal with the Canterbury and Surrey Hills Bendigo Bank branches for the supply of an electronic scoreboard.

We are currently finalising the design and costs associated with this scoreboard and anticipate that it will be built some time in 2008. Both Clubs are looking forward to our long term relationship with the Bank and we are extremely grateful to Dick Menting and his Board for providing us with the required funding for this very exciting project.

The Club has now moved all of our banking arrangements over to the Bank and I encourage everyone in the Club to seriously consider visiting either of the Bank's Branches to discuss how they can help you obtain a better financial advantage.

Ist XI Captains Report

Season 2006/07 was a successful one for the Ist XI. We started the season with a goal of playing consistent and good competitive cricket in all forms of the game, which we achieved in most instances.

With a new season it always brings new faces to the club and two most prized recruits were Victorian all-rounder Jon Moss and Ritchie Hassett from Geelong. Both of these players proved over the season why we had targeted them to join our fantastic club as they both provided match winning performances on several occasions which combined well with the hardness and the competitive spirit that we required in each game.

In the one day competition, we played a consistent brand of cricket with some fantastic powerful wins and some real fighting wins to get us over the line. Each player played a role in every game with a lot of even performances through out the campaign. We reached the semi-final in this competition and unfortunately lost to St Kilda. Even though we lost to the eventual winners we could hold our heads up high as we had come along way this season in our one day games, given last season we only one two matches.

In the two day game format, we were always there about's in each game. We had two stand-out games during the season versus Melbourne University that saw us compile a score 300+. They were then looking comfortable all day on a very flat pitch to be 2/220 at tea on the second day. That win saw us head to Frankston to play off in a semi-final. Unfortunately, I lost the toss on a sub standard wicket and we got rolled for just over 100 but the fighting spirit was there again with our bowlers and we ended up bowling them out that night with them having a lead of only 40 runs. Our goal the next day was to achieve a reverse out right to keep us in the premiership hunt with the wicket still doing plenty early. 2nd XI Captains Report

With the appointment of a new coaching panel, there was a new feel around the club. The structure of the pre-season was something we hadn't experienced previously and we believed this would set the club for a strong showing across all grades. The expectation for the Seconds was also very high after several development years and a finals spot seen as an achievable goal.

The new structure of the competition, with a One-day and Two-day competition, was a new challenge for all the players and gave us the opportunity to really focus on our game plans. This worked well for the Seconds with strong first up victories against Fitzroy-Doncaster and Footscray-Edgewater. Due to the nature of the split competitions it's very important to win early games, at the changeover from One-day to Two-day cricket; the Seconds were reasonably placed with 3 wins and 2 losses.

The seconds also started strongly in the Two-Day competition with a comfortable victory over Frankston-Peninsula. Leading the way was; Mark Dwyer with 4/40 off 19 overs; and in the batting Sam Parker with 71, Glen Parker with his maiden Second XI hundred of 129 and what can only be described as a swashbuckling 39 from Matthew Kremmer. Al Stewart-Holmes was also an admirable performer with 2/57 off 27 overs.

This first up win was followed by two more convincing victories against good opponents in Footscray-Edgewater and Melbourne University. Excellent performances from these games were; Nick Hutton 89 and Matthew Rafter 3/38 vs. Footscray-Edgewater; Ben Hanley 89 and Adam Hardy 78 vs. Melbourne Uni. Al Stewart-Holmes again led from the front with 31 runs and a match winning 4/42 off 24 overs against Melbourne Uni.

The outstanding performance from these two games was undoubtedly that of Sean DeKretser, who scored an unbeaten 200 against Footscray-Edgewater. On a very hot afternoon, Sean batted for the entire day and innings to record a magnificent double-century that consisted of twenty boundaries and put CMCC into an unbeatable position.

CMCC finished off their run to Christmas with a loss against Richmond and a strong win against Casey-South Melbourne in difficult conditions. This

game was extremely important for the seconds, not only to remain in the top two on the ladder but also as it gave opportunity for newer players to develop. It was very pleasing to see excellent performances from Blake Hedley 3/59 off 16 overs and Tim Leoncelli with a run a ball 78 not out. There were also good contributions from Nick Hutton again - 90, Alex Thompson - 94, James Pearson - 46 and Matthew Rafter 2/26.

After Christmas the Seconds began disappointingly with a loss to Ringwood, and effectively ended our chances of playing in the One-day finals. This led to some soul searching by the group and was the catalyst for a form reversal that would catapult the team to the top of the Two-Day competition come season end. The following week we bounced back with a big win against Melbourne at Melbourne which was a fantastic team effort. We outplayed Melbourne in all aspects and showed what we could produce as a team. Outstanding performances were Nick Hutton (64), Alex Thompson (62), Sam Parker (39) and Andrew Leoncelli (4/42 off 10 overs). It must also be highlighted the turning point of the game was the introduction of Alastair Stewart-Holmes (with Melbourne 1/125 off 25 overs) who completely turned the game with outstanding figures of 1 for 20 off 10 overs on a batting paradise.

Following on from the Melbourne win, the Seconds played in two very close games to record memorable victories. Both occasions we batted second and chased down targets over 300. First-up against North Melbourne we chased down 317, 9 wickets down in the last over of the day. Great performances were from Ben Smiljanic - 114, Glen Parker - 99 and Nick Hutton with 64. The following game we were drawn against Melbourne again and we knew we were in for a big challenge. Melbourne posted a big score of 328 with the pick of the bowlers being Matthew Hutton taking 4/72 off 19 and Andrew Leoncelli 2/38 off 15 overs. CMCC began well with an opening stand of 101 between Ben Hanley scoring a brisk 69 and Andrew Leoncelli - 35. CMCC continued to bat well throughout the day and were cruising at 4/286 until a mini collapse left us needing 4 runs with 1 wicket in hand. Damian Shanahan has changed the culture of the club this season and created a positive winning

feeling that can be built on for the next few years. His influence has been greatly appreciated and will be missed over the coming seasons. I would like to thank him personally for showing faith in me and always being available to offer ideas and guidance for me and the team. Thanks also to Shannon and Anthony, both of you have had a fantastic influence on the group this season that enabled the group to perform as well as it did.

I would also like to thank all the players in the club who made the year a most enjoyable one, especially the boys who played in the seconds. It was a great environment to be around and one that allowed new players to come in and be involved immediately. Thanks to Al Stewart-Holmes who did a great job leading the team when I was unavailable and all the boys who supported him during these times. We have an opportunity next year to go a few steps further.

3rd XI Captains Report

We started the season with only one player from the previous season and a very young team. Despite this, the round one team looked promising. However the club's list included a number of private school boys who were not available in November, February and March. When combined with the extensive number of injuries sustained by the top two elevens and a fourth eleven whose players were generally either too young or too old to be promoted, the third eleven was often not competitive during those months. The team was often trying to chase up numbers on a Friday night or Saturday morning and rarely played with 12 players (the opposition nearly always did). Seven wins was a very good return in the circumstances.

Despite a number of players showing promise at times, the batting was generally disappointing with many good starts by individuals not converted into big match-winning innings. On a number of occasions the last four or five wickets failed to accumulate ten runs between them. Lachie Ezard was a deserving winner of the batting average. He made two fifties and earned promotion to the seconds. Sis Jayasinghe made it to double figures on 13 of the 16 times he batted yet failed to make one half century.

The bowling lacked a front-line strike bowler, however the mediums and spinners were often able to bowl tightly, build pressure and restrict the opposition to a reasonable score. Sisitha Jayasinghe was the pick of the bowlers and a deserving winner of the bowling average. He sent down over 200 overs for the season and took 22 wickets whilst conceding less than 3 runs per over, often at the lightning quick Watson Park oval. Luke Vandenberg and Chad Duquesne showed some promise for the future. Joel Grumont bowled well at times after Christmas when given an opportunity. We were on track for one run out per game until round 10 but were only able to get two run outs during the last seven games. Karl Harms did a good job as keeper.

There were a number of highlights during the season:-

- We beat finalist Footscray twice during the season
- A new third eleven 9th wicket partnership record of 90 in round one
- The bowling of Matt Grose in the games he

played for us, including the 5/18 against Richmond and his initial spell of 2 wickets for none off 6 overs in the two dayer against Footscray

- Sis Jayasinghe's 6/97 against Melbourne Uni and his tireless bowling generally
- Adam Hardy's 84 against Footscray
- Will Shute's 109 not out against Dandenong
- The 6 LBW's in one innings we obtained against Frankston
- The last match win against Hawthorn with only two overs to spare in front of a large home crowd at Watson Park
- Sis Jayasinghe easily winning the team's best and fairest award

Special thanks to:-

- coach Damian Shanahan and his assistants (particularly Shannon Young and Anthony McQuire) for all their hard work during the season
- the captains of the other elevens, scorer Alex Roberts (when available), Gracey and the Committee for your efforts during the season
- the afternoon tea deliverers
- the parents, wives and supporters for their encouragement during the season.

Thank you also to all the players who played in the third eleven during the season for your support, assistance and friendship. I can report that the way the players played the game was a credit to them and the Club.

Finally, given that I retired after the last game, thank you to everyone involved with the club since 1973/74 for making my time with it so wonderful. I will miss the friendships and competition greatly. Also a huge thank you to my wife and family for all the support you have given me ...for without your support and understanding the many enjoyable hours I put in for the club would not have been possible. I look forward to seeing and reading about all "my boys" from the last few years progressing into (and succeeding in) the club's first eleven.

Junior Division Report

In many ways this was the best season we have had. We fielded 11 teams, played finals in 6 of 7 possible, grand finals in 4 (including all 3 A Grades) and won the 14B premiership. The 14B team played well all year and thoroughly deserved their win. Congratulations are due particularly to Phil Smith (manager), Simon Draycott (coach) and Nick Lindsay (captain). At first glance, it was disappointing not to win any of the three A Grade premierships since in all 3 divisions we had been top of the ladder all year. Yet I believe the boys will obtain as much from losing as winning – possibly more – and losing such important matches brings into focus values that are otherwise all too easily ignored. In losing, as in winning, it is not so much the result as how it is carried that is remembered. In all cases this season, all teams should be congratulated for their sportsmanship, their team spirit and their pride. Those teams – 16B and 16C in particular – who were faced with superior opponents in the semi-finals played with courage and determination and missed a place in the final by a mere quirk of fate. There were outstanding individual performances during the last several rounds as well as the semi-finals themselves. Those boys too – as well as they who were there – will remember the season well in years to come.

There were teams that did not do so well on the scoreboard: where boys who had played a few seasons mixed with complete novices and each had to live with the other; or where the odd talented player had to mix with others who appeared mediocre. Yet, with credit due on both sides – as well to the managers and parents – games were played almost always in good spirits and with tolerance. The U10 teams had a balanced and enjoyable entrée to Sunday morning cricket. The extent of parental involvement was instrumental in having a cohesive and happy squad. As ever, managers were sorely tested from time to time. (It is odd how it is always the other team which is so unreasonable). Often in hot and dry conditions due to the drought, the boys persevered beyond normal limits and discovered that such games are not always fun nor even, sometimes, worth the effort. In some, however, it spawns resolve.

The very junior teams by and large did not do extremely well, apart from the U12 A. Their managers recognized their limitations however and, to a team, played each game in the proper spirit. I am indebted again to all mentors and managers who dug deep throughout the season. There are times we all feel that Friday evenings and Saturday/Sunday mornings can be spent much more profitably.

The coaches and mentors hold the Junior Division together. The senior and A Grade coaches work hard on and off the match-day field. Bruce Richards, Glen Parker, Luke Muttdon, Simon Legg, John Flett, David Heywood and Warren Roberts all worked hard to ensure the U16 teams were hard to beat and never, ever, gave in. Chris Eldridge, Simon Draycott, Phil Smith, Andy Harper, Roger Dray, Will McMahon and Dan Wolfe all contributed to the U14 section with utter reliability, often in difficult circumstances. But with great results, invariably. Particular mention should be made of Colin Risby, Gareth Mellor, Mark Woolley and Stephen Davis whose efforts in the U12 contingent were exemplary and often amidst controversy of one sort or another. In the U12 A section, a variety of people took on the mantle at different times: Matt Emerson, Harry Down, Ron Lane, Jim Forsyth, Greg Keys, Peter Melville, Wayne Tarrant and Stewart Evans (most of the team, really). The U10 team manager, Mark Randles, on all reports displayed an aura of complete control – though rarely observed on Sunday mornings by the Pres himself – and brought the team to a very happy conclusion for all by season's end.

There were some outstanding individual efforts. Will Shute won the ECA Dave Dickie Award. He, Ayrton Eldridge and James Bett were also included in the U16 Dowling Team side – the latter two as first year U16. James was also selected in the State U15 Secondary School Team. Lachy Mahon, Amrith Eldridge and Alastair McMahon (vice-captain) were selected for the U14 Emus Turf Competition Team. Amrith was also selected in the State Primary School Team. Matt Keys (captain) and George McMahon were selected for the U12 Mitchell Shield which the ECA won for the first time (at last).

Louise deserves special mention for hosting our highly successful social night last year. And finally, to my own beautiful wife, who looks at the calendar, draws deep breath and sets herself for yet another season requiring late dinners, cut lunches, and great forbearance.
