Presidents Report

When a team wins a Premiership it is a fantastic experience for those players involved and a great achievement that binds them together forever. It also provides everyone else involved in the Club to share in the excitement and revel in the celebrations.

This was the case for the CMCC this season with the 3rd XI winning the premiership in a hard fought contest thanks to the great leadership of Bobby McDonald and his partner in arms Anthony "Jerry" McQuire.

The celebrations were certainly loud and long and the scenes in the rooms straight after the match were frantic and exciting not only for the players but everyone else as well. There was a sense of true excitement and achievement that hopefully will fuel those players who were not involved to take the next step and to work harder to win one for themselves no matter what the level.

The 3rd XI were certainly very deserving premiership winners having spent most of the season in the top four. Bobby captained and lead the team from the front and was well supported for the majority of the season by Jerry, who managed to combine his coaching and playing roles to finish the season with a magnificent century in the Grand Final that setup the win.

Due to his work and family commitments Jerry has decided that he cannot continue to be the Club's Senior Coach.

Jerry has been a fantastic coach and has been at the fore front of the overall improvement of the playing list and development of the players throughout this time. We wish Vicki, Mitch and himself all the best for the future and look forward to seeing him around as much as possible in the future.

The 2nd XI while not winning had a reasonably successful season under the leadership of new captain, Matt Hutton. They made the One Day Grand Final and for the third season in a row were involved in the Two Day semi finals.

As a first time captain, Matt acquitted himself very well and even managed to play a couple of 1st XI matches due to his own personal form.

For the 1st XI, the season started off very well winning four out of the first five matches however, we struggled to put enough runs on the board after that and as a result we didn't win any of our two day matches although in two cases we were well on track to record wins but were thwarted by wet weather.

Probably the highlight of the season was a draw versus the 1st XI premiers, Ringwood, at Camberwell which saw Glenn Parker make his maiden 1st XI century and ended with him trying to hit a six off the last ball for us to win.

To finish on the playing front, the success of the 3rd XI and positive aspects of the 2nd XI bode well for the forth coming season. The Club has appointed Steve Maddocks as the Senior Coach for the next two seasons and he brings along 15 years of coaching experience including winning a 1st XI premiership.

Off the field, the facilities at Camberwell are now second to none in the competition with the outfield refurbishment completed and electronic scoreboard in operation. As a result, we were chosen to host the 4th XI Grand Final and the way in which the ground was presented and the condition of the wicket was a testament to the time and effort of the Council and their curating staff.

We are very indebted to David Crowe and Glen Davie and their staff for the way in which they have refurbished the outfield and the constant time and attention they have put into the practice and playing facilities.

The electronic scoreboard is now in operation and provides a great finishing touch to what now must be one of the best sporting facilities in the City of Boroondara. Again, I'd like to thank both Councillor's Coral Ross and Dick Menting for all of their support, time and effort throughout the season.

With respect to the scoreboard a very big thank you to our partners at the Canterbury, Ashburton and Surrey Hills Community Bendigo Bank for their financial contribution and to Tim Shearer and the Old Scotch Football Club for managing and coordinating the installation of this great new asset.

Our other main partners, who we could not survive financially without, are our sponsors and I would like to thank all of them who have contributed during the season including Pulse Pharmacy, Cannon Toyota, and Jellis Craig.

The Committee has been outstanding through the current season and I am truly grateful for everyone's time and effort to ensure that the Club continues to operate and function as smoothly as possible.

Added to this, our new Cricket Administration Wayne Stewart has in the words of others 'been our best recruit'. Wayne's contribution in his first year has been outstanding and he was well rewarded with the Best Clubman trophy on Presentation Night which was very well deserved.

There are other volunteers who are not on Committee including Tony Grace – 1st XI Scorer, Pauline Wellard – 2nd XI Scorer, Meaghan King – 3rd XI Scorer, Karen Gallagher – 4th XI Scorer, "Speedie" Hurse – 1st XI Team Manager and Barry Hickey – CSG Ground Manager who do a wonderful job and to whom we are very appreciative of their time and commitment to the Club.

As one season ends another starts and we are well and truly into preparations for the next season. We are looking to recruit new players to increase our depth and improve our on-field performances, especially at the 1st XI level while ensuring there are ongoing opportunities at

higher levels for those in the lower XI's to strive for and take.

The appointment of Steve Maddocks as Senior Coach is the start and I also know that a group of players have taken it upon themselves to do their own fitness training during the off season to ensure they hit the ground running when pre-season starts.

Memorial Tribute

Vale – Keith Robert Downe

This year we record the passing of a former Camberwell player and Life-Member in Keith Downe, at the age of 90.

Keith was involved at Camberwell from 1935-55, played alongside many Club greats, and served in both the Royal Australian Air Force (as Leading Aircraftman) and the Army with 2/10 Infantry Battalion (as Corporal) during the Second World War. Consequently, he played most of his cricket with the Second and Third Elevens performing admirably during a successful era for the Club. Keith contributed on the Committee for many years, was a leading member of Thirds

premiership sides in 1946/47, 1951/52 and 1952/53, and later captained the Third Eleven in 1954/55. Amongst his best performances were 64 with the bat and 8/38 with the ball.

After leaving Camberwell, Keith ran a successful newsagency in Euroa for many years before retiring to Rosebud West. His son, Phil, a very capable allrounder, later played with distinction in the Camberwell First Eleven between 1973-76. Keith will be greatly missed by his many friends (including those at Camberwell) and we extend our deepest sympathy to wife, Gwen, and children, Phil and Jennifer.

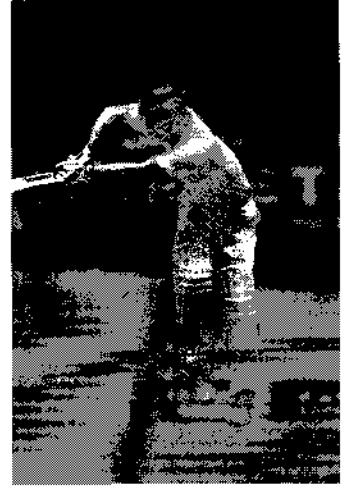
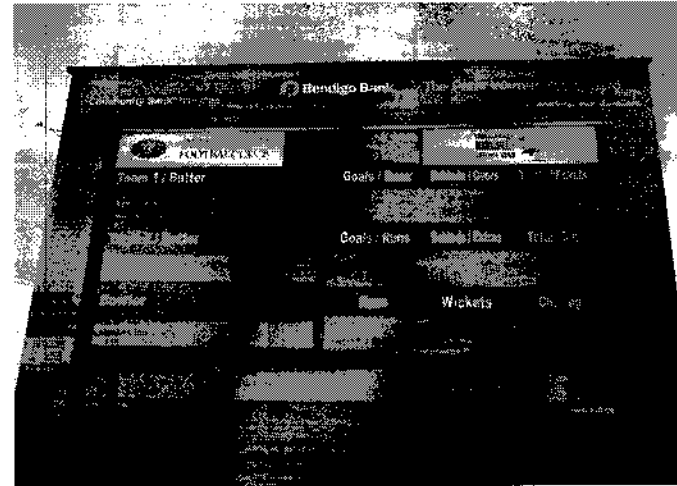
John & Joy McNamara

1st XI Captains Report

Season 2008/9 ended as a disappointing season for our 1st XI after such a promising start. The preseason saw experienced and popular Anthony McQuire continue for his second season as senior coach while the club welcomed recruits Jarrayd Dowling and Jack Joslin.

It was eagerly anticipated that the addition of the recruits to an existing group of young and up and coming players who have now been playing together for several seasons would turn out to be a successful recipe for the 2008/9 season. The start to the season indicated that this mix would be a tough one for the opposition to deal with, winning four out of our first five games – all one-day games.

It was now becoming evident that we had potential to be a formidable team and could also look forward to further improvement with the return of Troy Ryan from preseason shoulder surgery in round 7. However, with the arrival of two day cricket in round 6 our form and confidence began to decline as we were only able to come away with one more victory for the season.

In the one day competition we played 6 games for the season and were victors in five, gaining a bonus point against North Melbourne at Swan Hill along the way which saw the team finish 6th on the one-day ladder. Our success in the two day competition was the opposite and on a whole disappointing with three draws and five losses from eight games. While in the Primary Edge Cup we won one from two outings, defeating Prahran at home in front of large crowd.

Although finishing 6th on the one-day ladder and narrowly missing finals in that competition, an extremely disappointing 15th position on the final ladder was a big let down for the Club after such a promising start.

Several times during the season we were so close to a win only to be denied the points with a frustrating draw or a narrow loss. The loss of class players in Mathew Wade and Jeremy Bray in the latter part of the season left a big hole in our senior batting ranks and this showed at

crucial times as our batting tended to be the weaker half of our game. That is not to take anything away from our bowling group who worked well as a team, bowling out our more fancied opponents on flat batting wickets on more than one occasion.

Once again throughout the season we had some outstanding performances.

Matthew Wade, in his second season at the club started the season on fire with a century in round 1 against Footscray Edgewater, guiding the team to its first victory of the season. However, this form also carried into state cricket and resulted in his availability being limited to us. Matthew must be congratulated for his season which ended for him winning the Sheffield Shield for the Bushrangers.

Glen Parker, showed us this year that he has taken the next step and is a very important member of our team. His effort in scoring 105no on "Black Saturday" was an outstanding exhibition of dogged batting on such a terrible day and he nearly dragged the team over the line. His increase in confidence and fitness base throughout the season set a great example for other players at the club as he won the batting average for the season.

Matt Rafter, a veteran of the club but still finding his way in the first XI, took it on his broad shoulders to carry our new ball bowling attack, especially in the early part of the season with the absence of Ryan and after Christmas when Steve Gribble was injured. Winning the bowling award for the season was a fitting reward to a loyal member of this club, taking 29 wickets at 22.86 in 15 games. His 5 for 42 in an impressive 27 overs was a highlight of the season.

As with every season there are the people behind the scenes putting in as much as the players. As cricketers on the field we cannot do without their support and guidance.
