

ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 30 JUNE 1998

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE CAMBERWELL MAGPIES CRICKET CLUB INC. LADIES AND GENTLEMEN

The Committee of Management is pleased to present, for your reception and adoption, the Annual Report of the Camberwell Magpies Cricket Club Inc., for the 1997/98 cricket season. The Report also includes the Financial Statements for the period of 1 July 1997 to 30 June 1998.

Presidents Report

Our Club settled down in 1997/98 after the inaugural year of establishing ourselves with new team mates in the various competitions in which we play. Significant progress was made on and off the field during the year to the extent that we can now say that we truly are a merged club with clear objectives and much to look forward to.

At the outset I especially want to pay tribute to two people who set about to create our new club and from business pressures on the one hand, and perhaps a few creaky bones and a growing family catching up on the other, decided to relinquish their positions in 1997/98. I speak of course of Warren Roberts and the Captain of our VCA 2nd XI, Russell Thomas.

Warren presided well over the coming together of the two clubs and the initial year of the Camberwell Magpies, unfortunately he had to step down as Club President just as the season was getting under way, as a result of an ever increasing workload on the business front. Our sincere thanks to you Warren for your leadership in helping to establish and then oversee the first phase of our new Club.

Russell, for his part, took on the position from the outset of Secretary of the club Match Committee Chairman, as well as inaugural 2nd XI Captain - a fair workload for any individual. He has decided that all of this cannot continue and to devote his cricketing energies totally into the managerial side of the Club. As a result Russell retired as a player at the end of the 1997/98 season and we offer our sincere thanks to you Russell for your on field leadership during our first two formative years.

Taken overall we had a fairly satisfactory season on the field finishing top 5 in the VCA Club Championship, despite our extremely young VCA 3rd and 4th XI finishing the season well down in their respective ladders. Our VCA 1st XI under Anthony Amalfi had a magnificent year, finishing two games clear on top of the ladder at the end of the home and away matches.

From this position we then won a qualifying final and semi final to ultimately play Melbourne for the VCA Premiership at the Albert Ground. Unfortunately, we were not quite good enough on the day to take off the coveted pennant, and our congratulations are extended to the Melbourne Cricket Club on their well deserved victory.

The end of season 1997/98 was tinged with a degree of sadness as it saw the termination of a ninety year involvement with the VSDCA, an association which we have enjoyed immensely. Part of the VCA agreement to the formation of the merged club was for involvement with the VSDCA to cease after a short period, and that time has now come. Our thanks to the VSDCA Executive and to the other twenty seven clubs with whom we enjoyed excellent competition and great camaraderie over a very long period of time.

This change however now means that we can focus with great confidence on the development of our Club within the VCA and ESCA competitions, and to provide a clear structure for the many cricketers who will form the Camberwell Magpies, well into the future.

I would like to comment on the work of our Coach, Neale Price, his Assistant Coach, Speros Beasley and his unofficial assistant, Gerard "Polly" Sleeman.

Neale was extremely effective in his first year in the position after joining us from Frankston, having quickly gained the respect of all the players at all levels. His knowledge, advice and coaching techniques were of great benefit to the players and the Club looks forward to even greater benefit

with two less teams in 1998/99, and therefore an ability to work even more on an individual basis.

Speros and Polly were of great help to Neale, both during the pre-season and throughout the year, and I'm sure the success we enjoyed overall was due in no small measure to Neale and his able assistants.

Neale also undertook, together with Matthew Elliott, several coaching clinics on behalf of the Club in seven country areas during April/May. These were followed by further sessions at the Hawthorn Indoor Sports Centre during June for selected country and metropolitan boys and our special thanks to Neale for instigating and then carrying out this work on behalf of the Club. I am sure this will be the fore runner of a very good coaching program and something we as a VCA Club can be very proud of. Some excellent associations were formed and the responses received in the various country areas were second to none. Congratulations Neale on a marvellous job in this area and thanks to Matty for your time and interest in helping Neale.

David Levens offered his assistance to the Club during the season, working with players of all levels but particularly the senior levels, in helping them to establish and achieve personal goals. Many thanks David for your work which I am sure was extremely beneficial in a number of instances.

Congratulations to our two first class representatives in Matthew Elliott and Graeme Vimpani. Matthew was again selected to represent his country during the season, whilst Graeme again represented Victoria in 1997/98. The continued selection of these two players provide something tangible for all of our younger members to strive for and they both continue to be fine ambassadors for our Club.

Our Junior Section continues to work hard under Victor Steiner and his Committee to develop young cricketers, and again placed thirteen teams in three age groups on the field during the season. This is a mammoth task each week and unfortunately suffered a little this season as a result of Victor's several absences overseas during the year. However, this will be addressed in the coming season to ensure that the appropriate level of support is provided to our younger members.

My special thanks to John Reed. Nigel Fernando and the other officers of the City of Boroondara, to the Ground Management Committees of the Camberwell, Sports Ground, Watson Park, Corben Oval and the various grounds which cater for our thirteen Junior teams, for the continued facilities on which we play.

The City of Boroondara especially are a major partner of our Club and one which we wish to continue to work together with, to develop our facilities within the City for our many members.

We have a number of sponsors who provide a great deal of financial assistance towards funding the operations of our very large Club. Our Principal Sponsor, Harris Wood Toyota, has been assisting us for twelve years and we continue to be indebted to John Montigue and Dealer Principal Brent Cannon for this much valued ongoing support.

The Tower Hotel through Paul and Lorraine Fitzgerald, and subsequently Jim Stephen, continued this year as our Major Sponsor and again we are extremely grateful for their continued support.

We are also very much appreciative of the support of a number of other sponsors who are listed separately elsewhere in the Sponsorship report, but without whom the task of running a major cricket club would be that much more difficult. To all those organisations our heartfelt thanks.

Financially we finished the season with an Operating Loss of approximately \$1,000 and a Net Deficit of just over \$13,000 after some extraordinary once off expenses were taken into account. The Financial Report is detailed elsewhere by the Treasurer but your Committee will place heavy focus on the income side of our Club from next year. Members will have to realise that a commitment to the Club means just that - a commitment - to attend social functions and events. Not a maybe - which seems to be easily dismissed in members minds.

My thanks to Adam Smith who once again performed in his usual devoted manner to the finances of our Club.

I would like to convey a special thank you to our Patron in Chief, the Hon. Vern Wilcox C.B.E, QC, and to our Number 1 member, the Hon. Tom Reynolds M.L.A. State Minister for Sport and Recreation, for the continued support they give our Club. We are indeed fortunate that busy people such as Vern and Tom take such an interest in our Club and find the time to join with us throughout the season when time permits.

My special thanks to my Committee who have worked tirelessly throughout the year to make the Camberwell Magpies Cricket Club proactive and strong, and a place where players, members and supporters wish to be. Also to those unsung people who are part of most clubs, and very special, who help out in any number of ways to make the Club the best it can possibly be.

The new structure of six senior teams will enable the Club to fulfil its objective of developing a strong and successful VCA presence, whilst providing cricketing facilities and a true club culture for other members who aren't able to, or don't wish to provide commitment for higher levels of the game. At the same time we will continue to nurture our Junior Section to provide those boys with a clear path through to senior cricket.

And finally, with the growing demands on individual's time we are restructuring the focus of our General Committee to ensure that areas such as the following are kept constantly under review, as within this list lie the critical 'go forward' issues which I believe will determine the ongoing health of our Club:-

Senior Coach's Report

It gives me great pleasure to present my first Coach's Report for the Camberwell Magpies Cricket Club.

Season 1997/98 was again a difficult one for the Club in terms of training, playing and the administration that goes into coordinating grounds and players between the separate competitions of District, Sub-District, ESCA and Mercantile. Selection was always interesting and difficult when trying to provide 8 teams with an even balance, whilst attempting to make all teams competitive and keep players satisfied that they had been selected according to their performances.

I think the Selection Committee, headed by Russell Thomas, did an extremely good job. The Captains should be complimented for the manner in which they were prepared to work together for the sake of the Club, and at times, at the expense of their own team.

The pre-season was quite lengthy with a number of the younger players starting at Hawthorn Indoor in June. We have a very exciting year coming up in 1998/99 with all players now involved in only the District and ESCA Competitions and with ex-Camberwell players to once again have the opportunity to play at the Camberwell Sports Ground.

Although there is always disappointment involved when a Clubs tie with a Competition (Sub-District) no longer exists, it really does now make our Club truly strong. We can now bring all of our good players together, making our depth and quality, equal to, and probably better than any other District Club.

We now have the opportunity to be apart of something very exciting, and that is all aiming to be the 1998/99 Club Champions. Wouldn't it be great to see the Camberwell Magpies as the District Club Champion in only its third season, and the first with all players available for the one competition.

Good luck to all those players that have retired or moved on to Club coaching positions. My best wishes, and thanks for your support. Make sure you drop in occasionally.

Finally, thanks to the Club for my appointment and for supporting me throughout the season. I look forward to an even more successful season in 1998/99

1997/98 Teams

FINANCIAL REPORT

- Armed with the knowledge of our disappointing inaugural season off
 the field, the Committee this year was in a much better position to mange
 the financial position of the Club. As can be seen from the Accounts, this
 has resulted in a close to break even operating result for the year, which
 provides a solid base from which to maintain financial budgets in future
 years.
- The Committee has considered it prudent however to write off some once off extraordinary items, together with the costs incurred during the year in the establishment of a Junior Development program in the Boroondara area and in a number of country centres. The write off of these items includes the initial sightscreens at the CSG which proved to be inadequate, the cost of the establishment of Club Honour Boards, and the above mentioned cost of the Junior Development Program.
- The effect of making these write offs at the end of the year was to increase the Operating Deficit of \$1,223 from normal operations to an overall Net Deficit of \$13,473.
- The financial highlight of the year was undoubtably the improvement in revenue from social activities, thanks mainly to a great deal of hard work by Richard Wignall and Peter Warner. The bar result was also solid thanks again to the Williams family for running the bar and the VCA 1st XI for winning us two very profitable home finals! We must however remember that activities such as the Sports Celebrity Night and the \$100 Raffle are going to be difficult to arrange on an annual basis, and therefore events contributed the bulk of the social revenue this year. We therefore cannot rest on our laurels and must continue to seek further improvements in other areas of the Club's financial activities in order to consolidate the future of the Camberwell Magpies Cricket Club.
- You will also note that ground rentals continued to rise this season, a trend that is likely to continue into the future. Something to bear in mind next season is that supporting social function should be a more enjoyable way of funding these costs than paying higher subscription fees and match levies. More importantly is the support that should be given to your team mates who put in many hours of effort in arranging the social functions which are an important facet of this great Club of ours.

On the sponsorship front, we all need to support the super efforts of Tim Shearer and others to attract new sponsors to the club and, even more importantly, support our sponsors wherever we can. I am sure you all share my sincere appreciation to all our sponsors for their generous support throughout the year and to the large number of club members who have in return shown their support for our sponsors.
