



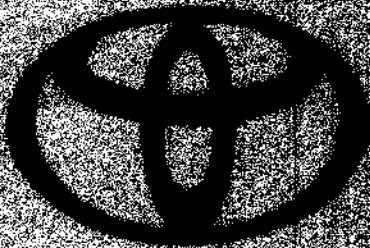

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN

The Committee of Management is pleased to present, for your reception and adoption, the Annual Report of the Camberwell Magpies Cricket Club Inc., for the 1999/2000 cricket season. The Report also includes the Financial Statements for the period of 1 July 1999 to 30 June 2000.

### **Presidents Report**

#### **ONFIELD**

The CMCC enjoyed its best season on the field in its short merged history.

The first 3 Premier Competition teams all played off in finals with the magnificent 2<sup>nd</sup> XI taking the Premiership after a very hard fought, tough, ask no quarter, give no quarter grand final against Hawthorn Waverley. The 4<sup>th</sup> XI nearly completed a quadrilla in finals participation for the Club in coming home strongly after Christmas without losing a match to finish only 1 game from the finals rounds.

Unfortunately the Firsts and Thirds both succumbed to stronger opposition in Qualifying Finals to drop out of the Premiership race.

The end result of all of the above was to complete the year in 4<sup>th</sup> position in the VCA Club championship, a mighty result and the highest we have ever finished in this coveted award.

Our Dowling Shield team under Lloyd Devlin added further success to the above results in winning 5 rounds and the semi final to enter the grand final of this prestigious competition undefeated, only to be beaten by the Geelong team in the final match. Congratulations to the whole Dowling squad, Lloyd Devlin, Tim Playfair and all associated with the Group on a great effort.

The ECA A and D Grade teams had mixed years with the former not quite good enough to play in finals after a reasonable start to the season whilst the D Grade team under the old fox Peter Gannon came home with a number of wins after Christmas to just miss further finals competition.

All in all it was a very strong and successful year for the Club as in addition to the onfield results a large number of very talented younger players donned the Club colours for the first time and will push hard for a place in higher elevens in coming seasons.

#### **COACHING STAFF**

Neale Price with his very able Assistant Coach Gerard "Polly" Sleeman were again appointed to direct the Magpies on field and to develop the Club's playing strength with a combination of the excellent senior talent and the large number of younger players available to the club. This they have done in great fashion and we look forward with confidence to the years that lie ahead.

The results of the season speak for themselves but behind the actual playing successes is the development work done by our

Coaching staff in fostering and encouraging players to achieve their own optimum level of performance. This work is unheralded but the results will be seen in time to come.

Unfortunately Neale Price had to reluctantly step down as Club Coach at Christmas time due to his increasing workload as a VCA Regional Cricket Manager. Polly Sleeman was asked to pick up the reins for the remainder of the season and this he willingly did, continuing the good work of directing the playing side of our large Club. As the classics suggest - the rest is history as we continued on to an excellent end result.

To Neale and to Polly, a very sincere thank you from all at the CMCC for an outstanding effort in recording the Club's best results to date and with all sides poised and looking forward to continuing the successes generated during 1999/2000.

Your Committee has re-appointed Gerard Sleeman as the Head Coach of the Club for season 2000- 01 and appointed Mr. Des King as our Batting Coach to assist Polly in this area. Des has had a wealth of experience at Northcote and latterly Fitzroy Doncaster, as well as being on the staff and helping a large number of boys at Xavier College over a long period of time.

We welcome Des and congratulate and will give utmost support to Polly as we strive for further excellence throughout our Club.

#### **JUNIOR SECTION**

Our Junior section performed with success during the year, although without reaching the heady levels of on field performance of the previous season.

Further integration of the Junior and Senior sections of the Club took place as the season progressed and it is hoped that assistance in developing the skills and knowledge of the young Magpies and the interaction between the two sections of the Club will continue to grow strongly each year.

Congratulations to David Draycott and his hard working Junior Committee, Managers and Parents for again managing so efficiently 140 odd children on Friday nights and Saturday mornings during the season.

#### **FACILITIES**

The refurbishment of the CSG oval was completed on time prior to the commencement of the season and provided the Club with absolutely first class playing conditions. Our sincere thanks to the City of Boroondara for undertaking these works which I am sure will reflect very well on both the Club and the Council for many years to come.

Our turf practice facilities were not available until after the Christmas break as a result of the timing of some net issues but once under way facilitated excellent practice conditions for the remainder of the season.

One of the Club's uppermost objectives has been to provide the very best of facilities for our players and we can now tick that box as being completed.

On the subject of facilities we are indebted to our Curators Gordon McQueen at CSG and John Crowle at Watson Park who provided us with first class wickets, week after week, and enabled players to look forward to their matches on home tracks. Our special thanks also to Nigel Fernando and Tony De Preu and their people for their assistance in providing the overall facilities we enjoyed throughout the season.

#### DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

The Club continued strongly with the Development Program commenced in earnest last season and again conducted a number of clinics for different age groups during the year.

- ◆ Our Coaching staff conducted a small clinic for local boys aged 15 - 17 during our pre-season Camp at Kyabram.
- ◆ We continued with a number of clinics at Hawthorn Indoor Cricket Centre for 3 different age groups-
  - age 13 - 16 with 25 - 30 boys in attendance each time for 6 sessions with video analysis;
  - age 16 - 18 with 15 - 20 boys for 6 sessions;
  - age 18 upwards with approx. 20 boys for a further 6 sessions.
- ◆ Our Coaching staff and senior players participated in a pre match clinic for a large number of children at Maryborough during our country round match with Ringwood in January.
- ◆ Our Coaching staff conducted a clinic for 40 boys who travelled to Camberwell in a bus with their parents from Bacchus Marsh C.A. during February.
- ◆ A level 0 Coaching course for approx. 12 Junior Team Managers was also conducted by Neale and Polly during October.

We as a senior Premier Club believe very strongly in the Victorian Pathway system. As such we will continue to work closely with clubs and schools as well as our own junior section in our "Inner Eastern Zone" to identify and help develop the undoubted talent which lies within our region.

Marty Gleeson as the VCA Regional Cricket Manager for this region is doing a mighty job and will continue to receive our full and complete support in the work he is doing in developing young cricketers of all ages and assisting the Clubs and Associations in the Inner East.

#### MASTER PLAN

As a representative of the CMCC I attended a number of further meetings of the CSG Master Plan Development Committee during the past 12 months to canvass and determine the various issues put forward by interested parties. The stage has now been reached wherein all are satisfied with the proposed Master Plan for the further development of the site which should now be submitted to Council within the very near future.

#### FIRST CLASS REPRESENTATIVES

Our congratulations to our two First Class representatives in Matthew Elliott and Graham Vimpani who were again selected for higher honours during the season. Both are fine ambassadors for the Magpies and their continued selection provides a tangible incentive for all of our players to reach for higher personal goals.

#### LEADERSHIP FORUM

The Club recently conducted a Leadership Forum for our senior playing group and we are indebted to Russell Thomas for organising the day and facilitating strong discussion on a whole range of issues.

We are also very appreciative of the assistance provided by the

Victoria Police College, and in particular Chief Inspector Chris Coster who took the group through the issue of "What is Leadership" to commence proceedings.

It is hoped that our Leadership group will all have gained from the discussion and be able to assist other club personnel as they progress with the club.

#### SPONSORS

A separate Sponsorship report is set out elsewhere in this Annual Report but let me personally express the Club's gratitude to all of those people and organisations who joined with us this year in some financial capacity. Your Committee is very conscious of the Club's role and that funds will not continue to be provided without a real and genuine commitment from the club to play its part to promote the products or services of its sponsors.

Our sponsors are our partners; they are a stakeholder in our Club, together with our members, the City of Boroondara, and our supporters. We must never forget all the parties who together contribute to make our club a worthwhile place for us all to be.

From all at CMCC Bev., please accept our grateful thanks for a role which is very necessary but too often goes unheralded. You are an absolute gem to our club.

Your Committee worked very hard during the year to pursue its stated objectives, and overall can be delighted with the Club's performance as a whole during the year. We have come a long way in four years and believe that the stage is now set to strongly move forwards in all areas of Club life, both on and off the field.

## New Life Members

Tim Dew, Matthew Elliott and Rohan French are the newly elected Life Members.

### Tim Dew

Tim started his playing career at Camberwell in 1980/1981 and showed enormous potential and classy stroke-play. He scored 4 centuries in his first four years, the most significant being his 101 in the 1984/85 2<sup>nd</sup> XI semi-final against Melton.

Tim's batting was complemented by magnificent catching in the slips, which included an astonishing 8 catches at 2<sup>nd</sup> slip in the 1988/89 finals series.

Tim has overcome many hurdles, notably chronic fatigue syndrome and a cricket month in hell in the early 1990's. He impaled himself on a stump while fielding at practice, he was hit in the head by an errant throw from a fieldsmen while running between the wickets and was hit in the head on another occasion while attempting to hook.

He toured England with Camberwell in 1989 and socially he

contributes year after year. Up to date, Tim has played over 200 games and amassed over 4500 runs. He also played in two winning premierships teams in 1985/86 and 1988/89. Well done and congratulations, Tim!

### Matthew Elliott

Matthew first played for Collingwood CC in 1986/87, starting in the 3<sup>rd</sup> XI as a raw, shy kid from the bush. It was evident to everyone, even at this early age that the kid could play and higher honours would soon come his way.

Even as a 16 year old his elegant driving and willingness to hook and pull were evident, he became the backbone of the 2<sup>nd</sup> XI batting during their premierships season in 1988/89 and he made his 1<sup>st</sup> XI debut in 1989/90.

Since then Matthew has reached even higher heights, representing Australia and Victoria with distinction. He is definitely the best batsman in this state at the present time and we are all hopeful the Test honors are not too far away.

With all these other cricket commitments it is not easy for Matthew to spend much time at the CMCC, but when he does, he is a terrific role model and his presence and happy go lucky demeanor is appreciated by everyone at the Club.

To date at premier cricket level, Matty has scored over 3000 runs at an average of 35.75. undoubtedly his best innings, was his effort in carrying his bat throughout the entire innings in the 1992/93 grand final against Melbourne. His 153 not out was one on the great grand final innings in the history of the game at this level and it was unfortunate that all of his efforts could not secure a well deserved victory, with the Pies losing to the demons by six runs.

### Rohan French

Rohan joined the Collingwood CC in 1985/86 and after several seasons working his way through the lower XI's he made his 1<sup>st</sup> XI debut in 1990/91. From that day on he was an integral part of the 1<sup>st</sup> XI and one of the key and tightest bowlers in the VCA Competition.

He bowled with good speed and used his height to perfection with variable bounce and a quicker delivery that surprised many batsman. Added to this, he had a fantastic pair of hands and took many fine catches all over the field, but especially so in the slips and at fine leg. His catch of Craig Bustard, at fine leg, in the 1992/93 grand Final against Melbourne will live long in the memory of all those in attendance.

In 124 1<sup>st</sup> XI matches, Rohan took 224 wickets at an average of 22.91 a truly fantastic record. He took 5 wickets or more on 7 occasions with best bowling figures of 6/54.

Around both Clubs, he was outstanding club-man, always friendly, except with a cricket ball in his hand, and liked by everyone, including the opposition. He attended nearly all social functions and also lent a hand where ever required any time any one asked. It was truly a sad day when everyone learnt that Rohan had to retire, prematurely due to a debilitating back injury.

Congratulations Rohan, your life Membership is well deserved.

## MILO Have-A-Go Program

Our club is very focused on playing its part as a good community member of the City Of Booroondara. So for the third successive year we ran an Australian Cricket Board designed programme for primary school students (aged 6 to 10) on Saturday mornings from 8.45 to 10.15 at Camberwell Road.

About 55 participants (last year 65, the year before 35), both boys and girls, enjoyed eleven sessions involving warm-ups and games, skill work and structured mini-matches. These sessions would not have been possible without the involvement of the participant's parents who ran each of the sessions under my overall guidance. Thanks to all for getting involved.

Apart from the eleven sessions, the following activities were also conducted during the season :-

1. the twelve oldest participants provided part of the lunchtime entertainment at the Boxing Day test match at the MCG.
2. Christmas breakup sausage sizzle.
3. Certificate Presentation day and final breakup

## FINANCIAL REPORT

A solid season financially to match our solid season on the field. A small surplus after extraordinary items reflects our best financial result in our short merged history. Our balance sheet is very stable after the decision to write-off the remaining turf from Victoria Park and shorten the depreciation period of some other major assets.

The highlight of our financial performance was undoubtedly social and sponsorship revenue – up by over \$10,000 on previous seasons. Three factors contributed to this result. Increased takings from the bar and thanks to David Draycott, Roger La Brooy, Tim Playfair, Russell Thomas, Peter Warner and a few others who helped to make our trial rostering system successful. Social functions were well attended by the players and showed an improvement in contributing to the finances of the Club over the previous year. The major factor was an increase in the sponsorship dollars of around \$7,000. Credit must go firstly to Peter Warner for his efforts in alerting the local business community to the benefits of being associated with a strong and successful club such as ours. Secondly, to the members of the club who continue to support our sponsors and strengthen the relationship we have with them.

The revenue generated from social and sponsorship meant that we were able to absorb a few unforeseen expenses (such as Chaucer's going bankrupt after accepting our \$1000 deposit for Presentation Night), and, have enough left over to invest in facilities, player welfare and development.

On the former we carpeted the club-rooms and put additional funds into practice wickets and new turf. On the latter, we funded a number of indoor coaching sessions for promising youngsters in our area and from the country. We also invested more heavily in injury management services such as massages for the players.

The junior section once again ran a modest surplus thanks to the efforts of David Draycott, Andrew Barton and I'm sure a host of others. The other pleasing aspect was the diligence of the many off-field volunteers in keeping an eye on expenditure which shows in the lower administration costs for the season.

Pre Xmas the 2<sup>nd</sup> XI started with mediocre return of 3 victories and 5 losses. During the early months, the batsmen to play well were Anthony Blackwell (181 vs Ess), Stuart Cann (142 vs Foots), Brad Shadbolt (89 vs S.Melb), Mark White, Troy Arendarcikas, Mark Gnatt, Nick Walker and Lloyd Devlin. We witnessed 2 big batting partnerships - Cann (142) and Arendarcikas (85) put on 217 vs Footscray, and Blackwell (181) and White (81) put on 175 vs Essendon. Good bowling performances were seen by Lloyd Devlin (two 4 wicket games), Brad Cranston (one 4/-), Craig Francis (one 4/-), Tim Mawdsley and Marcus Lancaster.

Post Xmas the 2<sup>nd</sup> XI turned their season around, and it was a credit to all concerned that this was achieved, after an under achieving 1998/99 and 1999/00 (Pre Christmas). The 2<sup>nd</sup> XI won 6 games (one outright) and lost 1 game. Good batting was seen by Chris Trewin (126 vs Dand), Will Elliott (77 vs Uni in his 2<sup>nd</sup> XI debut), Stuart Cann, Brad Shadbolt and Nick Walker. The batting highlight post Christmas was Chris Trewin's chanceless century against Dandenong. Bowling contributions came by all who played, with Craig Francis (8/-, 5/- & 4/-), Marcus Lancaster (5/-), Brad Cranston (4/- & two 3/-), Lloyd Devlin (two 3/-) and Tim Mawdsley (3/- & always got an early wicket). The bowling highlight was Craig Francis' 9/85 match figures against Melbourne, which included 8/48 off 32 overs in the 1<sup>st</sup> innings.
